## Cofece submits for public consultation its draft amendment to the Regulatory Provisions of the Federal Economic Competition Law

- The amendments to the Regulatory Provisions aim at strengthening the current competition regulations.
- The consultation will be open from today until January 2, 2024.

**Mexico City, December 14, 2023.-** The Federal Economic Competition Commission (Cofece or Commission) started a public consultation on its Preliminary Draft of amendments to the Regulatory Provisions of the Federal Economic Competition Law (LFCE in Spanish). The amendments aim to strengthen the current competition regulations, particularly in relation to the issuance of precautionary measures and bail requests.

It is of relevance for the Commission to know the opinion of the economic agents, the private sector, and society in general; therefore, it opens a public consultation period for 20 calendar days that starts on December 14 of this year and ends on January 2, 2024.
